Reflections and Ministry Opportunities...



The Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and covers a period of approximately six weeks before Easter Sunday. The traditional purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer to receive the new life of (Easter) resurrection power through prayer, fasting, reflection and the repentance of sins. Lent is traditionally described as lasting for forty days, in commemoration of the forty days which Jesus spent fasting in the desert, where he was tempted by the Devil. The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 22. Palm Sunday is April 2 and Easter Sunday is April 9.

Lenten Prayer Challenge: Consider challenging someone to be your prayer partner for the Lenten Season beginning Feb. 22 - Palm Sunday, Apr. 2. You would commit to pray for this person daily that they would grow in their faith through Lent as they move toward the celebration of new life on Easter Sunday.

In February and March, we will look at how life can be a struggle when it comes to family and relationships. Valentine's Day, February 14, is a challenging day for many because our relationships and family connections may not be fulfilling. In Matthew 19 Jesus is asked a question by the Pharisees about divorce and he responds by quoting Genesis 2: "Haven't you read," Jesus replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man will Relationships leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh? So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." In February and March we will look at what Jesus has to say about life, family and basic discipleship: his words help us better understand the pressing issues of abortion, gender, marriage, divorce and the challenges of discipleship. It's my hope that through this series we will be drawn closer to Christ, understand his created order, and grow in our compassion for others.

Consider a Spiritual Reboot During the Season of Lent

We have all found ourselves stuck and trying to troubleshoot a problem on our computers, smartphone, or other electronic devices. According to multiple studies, one of the biggest time-wasters in the workplace are computer-related malfunctions.

One study found that the average person spends 22-25 minutes a day trying to fix a computer -related issue. The estimated cost to larger companies in the US is somewhere in the ballpark of \$4,000.00 a minute. One easy solution for many of these issues could be as simple as turning off your device.



Over half of computer problems technicians deal with can be fixed with a simple reboot. The reason that computers often fail is that they have systems processes continually running behind the scenes. These processes leave behind an electronic footprint that takes up memory (RAM). When you turn off a computer or smartphone, these programs and processes end, allowing you to start on a clean slate with a faster and more efficient working device.



<u>A Hindu Meets Jesus in Worship</u>

A Hindu tells the story of attending church for the first time as a teenage boy:

The small group of Indian believers met in a very run-down house, but there was something very special about their worship. It was hard not to be enthusiastic if what this song said was true!



No one had started to preach, but already I had learned so much. What a contrast between the relationship these Christians had with Jesus and the ritualistic appeasement of the gods at Hindu ceremonies! I had never heard anyone say that a Hindu god was "wonderful" or a "counselor." Certainly no one would sing like that about Shiva, about Kali, his bloodthirsty wife, or about their favorite son, Ganesha, half-elephant and half-human! And they called Jesus the Prince of Peace!
